

Old Business/Issues:

Role of the Committee: Ryan Ruda addressed the group and spoke to the role of this committee.

The role of the committee is to serve as a sounding board and provide input for curriculum instruction.

KS Reduction in Credit Hours for Degrees: Ryan Ruda addressed the group on this matter.

KBOR has communicated to GCCC that degrees conferred by community colleges must not exceed 60 hours.

GCCC is proceeding to offer 60 hour AS, AA, AAS, and AGS degrees of 60 hours beginning with students entering during the 2018/19 school year (that would be working under the requirements of the 2018-20 course catalog). Input from the committee is appreciated.

Ideas discussed included:

- Removing 1 or 2 cr/hrs from the HPER requirement
- Removing 2 cr/hrs of electives

Sociology at GCCC:

As part of mapping GCCC's outcomes to the essential skill, diversity, being added there is a discussion of whether this essential skill will be specifically mapped to PSYC101 (General Psychology) and possibly SOCI101 (Introduction to Sociology) or mapped to a variety of courses for all degree paths.

The outcome of this discussion could also impact whether the AS Social Science requirement may remain at 6 hours or expanded to 9 hours.
