On the afternoon of Oct. 11, about 50 Lakin Elementary School students got to tour our fire science training facility, learn about fire safety, and got to try on and demo fire equipment. The students also visit the GC Fire Department as part of the GCCC partnership with our local department.

#### Black Hills Energy Volunteer Day—Oct. 22

Employees from Black Hills Energy spent their annual volunteer day painting the Williams Stadium fence for us on Oct. 22. We appreciate those employees giving back to their community and saving us time and labor on this project.

#### Broncbuster Buddy Day—Oct. 28

Broncbuster Buddy Day was held on Sunday, Oct. 28, in the DPAC East Gym. It was moved away from Broncbuster Stadium due to the cold weather. Several youngsters joined our football team to practice drills and play with the team. It was a fun event for everyone involved.

#### Kansas Music Educators Association Prep Day—Oct. 16

#### Halloween Costume Contest—Oct. 31

Our GCCC employees showed off their creativity during Halloween, especially the Academic Building. They won our building contest with their "100 Years of Horror" team costume. Vicky Reyes won the overall individual contest. Employees also packed candy bags for the children at Community Daycare. The candy was delivered during the CDCC Parade on Nov. 1.

Employees also showed off their cooking talents with our new, annual chili cook-off. At least six teams competed for the title of best chili and tie-breaking dessert entry, with the winner yet to be announced.

#### In Competition

#### Quiz Bowl Wins GC Invitational Meet - Nov. 2

On Nov. 2 the Quiz Bowl team hosted and won the one-and-only home tournament of the year, which kicked off the competition season. GCCC hosted teams from western Kansas and Oklahoma in a smaller tournament than we anticipated with both Cloud County and Hesston Colleges having to withdraw due to scheduling conflicts. Nevertheless, we had a great day with some great competition. GCCC places first with a 4-0 record.

#### Meat Judging Team Winds Reserve National Champion 2019—Oct. 28

The Garden City Community College 2019 Meats Team began their year with a great performance at the Southwest Invitational contest in Friona and Lubbock, Texas, on Friday and Saturday, January 11<sup>th</sup> and 12th. The team finished second overall, finishing only 23 points behind the first-place team, and finishing as Champions in Beef Grading and Total Beef, while taking 2<sup>nd</sup> in Lamb Judging, Pork Judging, Beef Judging, Questions and Placings. The final team score of 3589 was the highest the team had scored since 2013.

Several individuals on the team performed well, including **Dallie Metheney** of Scott City, who scored highest individual overall, surpassing the competition by 24 points. Metheney also placed 1<sup>st</sup> in Beef Grading, 1<sup>st</sup> in Total Beef, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Beef Judging, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Questions, 4<sup>th</sup> in Pork Judging and 5<sup>th</sup> in Placings. **Emily Glenn**, also of Scott City, was 8<sup>th</sup> overall placing 5<sup>th</sup> in Total Beef. **Kyle Hammond** (Holcomb) placed 10th overall as an individual and was High Individual in Lamb Judging with a perfect score—a feat that has not been accomplished since 2016. Hammond also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in Placings. **Ben Bradbury** (Winfield) was 18<sup>th</sup> overall placing 4<sup>th</sup> in Beef Grading.

#### Students Save Over \$780,000 Since Fall 2018 with Cengage Unlimited

In the Fall of 2018 Garden City Community College adopted a Cengage Unlimited textbook model, providing an online textbook subscription for every GCCC student. The new model added a resource fee of \$8 per credit hour

to the tuition and fees structure for the cost of attendance, but has saved students an estimated \$780,000 on textbook costs since its inception.

Since Fall of 2018, GCCC students have taken 65,399 credit hours, spending only \$523,192 on the Cengage Unlimited resource. By comparison, under the previous system, the student body would have spent \$1.3 million on textbooks and supplies for the same number of credits. Over \$780,000 in savings overall accounts for a 60% savings to students.

Prior to the adoption of the Cengage model, students were advised to expect to pay up to \$600 per year on textbooks and supplies at GCCC, based on a 30 credit-hour year. Under the new model, students pay only \$240 for the new Cengage Unlimited model with the same number of credit hours.

#### Department of Public Safety Gun Raffle—Nov. 1st

Although the annual Shoot for Scholarships event was cancelled this year, DPS was able to raise funds for scholarships through a gun raffle. The Endowment and DPS sold \$3,000 worth of Raffle tickets to fund scholarships and David Rupp was named the winner of the drawing on Facebook Live on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### NOTICE OF CLAIM PURSUANT TO K.S.A. § 12-105b

To the Board of Trustees,

We previously sent you correspondence on behalf of Joanne Atkins-Ingram and the estate of Braeden Bradforth, dated July 23, 2019, providing notice and making a demand under the Kansas Tort Claims Act. By this letter, the earlier demand is withdrawn. Pursuant to this letter, our clients demand \$10,000,000.00 to settle the claims under the Kansas Tort Claims Act.

On behalf of Joanne Atkins-Ingram and the estate of Braeden Bradforth, this letter serves as notice, pursuant to K.S.A. § 12-105b(d), of Ms. Atkins-Ingram's intent to bring tort claims against Garden City Community College and certain employees, including former Head Coach Jeff Sims (together, "GCCC").

GCCC is already aware that Braeden Bradforth died following a football practice at the school facilities on August 1, 2018. The first day of August also was the first day of football practice. Mr. Bradforth had arrived on campus just two days earlier.

GCCC required Mr. Bradforth to complete 36 fifty-yard sprints within 8 seconds. Mr. Bradforth's teammates have stated that he visibly struggled to complete the sprints, falling to his knees and gasping for air. According to witnesses, Head Coach Sims screamed obscenities at Mr. Bradforth as he struggled to complete the sprints.

GCCC has stated that water was available on the sidelines. However, other players on the team have confirmed that there was a penalty for drinking water. If a player drank water, GCCC would require him to repeat the 36 sprints the following morning as punishment.

Approximately two hours after practice began, Mr. Bradforth abruptly began walking off the field. One coach watched him stumble as he walked and did not reasonably assess his condition. When GCCC found Mr. Bradforth in severe distress, it waited nearly 30 minutes before calling for emergency medical care. Mr. Bradforth's death was due to exertional heat stroke.

Based upon the above-referenced facts, Ms. Atkins-Ingram intends to bring claims for the negligence resulting in Mr. Bradforth's death. Ms. Atkins-Ingram also intends to bring claims under federal law, including 42 USC § 1983.

On behalf of herself and the estate of Braeden Bradforth, Ms. Atkins-Ingram demands \$10,000,000.00 to resolve the claims under the Kansas Tort Claims Act.

On behalf of Sean Bradforth and the pending estate of Braeden Bradforth, this letter serves as notice, pursuant to K.S.A § 12-105b(d), of Mr. Sean Bradforth's and the pending Estate of Braeden Bradforth's intent to bring tort claims against Garden City Community College and certain employees, including, but not limited to, former Head Coach Jeff Simms (hereafter referred to together as "GCCC").

#### 1. Claimants' Name & Address and Attorney's Name & Address:

#### Claimants:

Sean Bradforth, father of Braeden Bradforth, deceased, individually and on behalf of all heirs (Pursuant to the Kansas Wrongful Death Statute). Sean Bradforth is also in the process of opening the Estate of Braeden Bradforth. The Estate of Braeden Bradforth will be an additional claimant.

Sean Bradforth and the Law Firm of Preuss | Foster Law has retained counsel in New Jersey to open the estate of Braeden Bradforth. The estate is being opened in New Jersey and Sean Bradforth will be asking the Court to make him the administrator and/or co-administrator of the estate. Mr. Bradford may also suggest that a 3<sup>rd</sup> party be named as an administrator.

#### 2. Factual basis for claim:

On August 1, 2018, Braeden Bradforth was attending the first day of college football practice at Garden City Community College, in Garden City, Kansas. Braeden Bradforth died on said date. Claimant alleges it was the negligence of the school, its employees, coaches, training staff, etc. that led to Braeden's death. The school is aware of the underlying factual basis of Mr. Bradforth's claims, the estate claims and the school has publicly stated that they have investigated the factual basis for Mr. Bradforth's death. Although our investigation is ongoing, it appears the College employees were abusive to the players and prohibited the players from staying hydrating. The school also failed to provide appropriate medical treatment to Braeden and failed to have qualified individuals at the practice to assess and treat the players at the practice. The College has performed two internal investigations and is aware of the factual basis for the claims. Although, the latest internal investigation has not been made public to the claimants, the claimants incorporate those factual findings into this notice.

#### 3. Names of any public employees involved:

The investigation by the school failed to name all of the employees. The employees involved will be the board for the Garden City Community College, Coach Simms and his coaching staff, Trainer Horton and all the training staff, any public employee that was part of the practice and/or provided any treatment to Braeden. Many of these names were not released as part of the college's investigations. We incorporate the names of any other employees of Garden City Community College contained within the internal investigation of the college that as of this date has not been released. Once again, claimant incorporates the names of the employees of Garden City Community College that are contained within the internal investigation report.

#### 4. Nature and extent of injuries:

Braeden Bradforth died. He was 19 years old. The nature and extent of Sean Bradforth's injuries and the other heirs, for the loss of Braeden Bradforth, are immeasurable. Sean Bradforth and the heirs have suffered great loss, including but not limited to, mental anguish, bereavement, loss of society, care, comfort, protection, etc. Claimant will be alleging all of the damages/injuries allowed under the Kansas Wrongful Death Statute. Claimant estate will also be making claims for the pain and suffering, and any other damages allowed under Kansas law that Braeden suffered prior to his death or because of his death. These claims will include, but not be limited to, claims brought under federal law, such as 42 USC § 1983.

#### 5. Amount of damages sought:

A jury, after hearing the evidence in the case, will find damages far in excess of 40 million dollars for claims allowed under the Kansas Tort Claims Act. We believe the evidence in this case will be that the individuals named in this letter violated Braeden Bradforth's civil rights. We will be filing additional claims under the Reconstruction Civil Rights Acts, particularly **Section 1983**, and the Administrative Procedure Act. Claimant will also be alleging punitive damages in this case.
